Fall Convention Course Overview

Acid Reflux

~ Treatment and Prevention ~

A soft tissue approach, that may be done by massage therapists, to help those who suffer with acid reflux and prevent it from returning.

Many times there is an issue with either the:

- 1. Esophageal Sphincter? It is abnormally relaxed and allows the stomach's acid to flow back into the esophagus.
- 2. Diaphragm? It is not functioning properly to assist the esophageal sphincter in closing tightly.
- 3. Stomach? The stomach is producing too much acid for the body to handle.

This class focuses on:

- 1. Postural Analysis Assessment- Specific to each organ so if someone has Acid Reflux you will know from their specific postural imbalances what needs to be treated.
- 2. Soft Tissue Treatment which muscles to address to impact each specific nerve pathway that helps with this condition.
- 3. This class is almost all hands on with assessment and treatment so that after the class you will have the confidence to help anyone with this condition.

NAME: Tara Hall CITY: Aberdeen

FAMILY: Husband Jeff, son John 14, daughter Crystal 34 and her husband Omar Romero and my 2 grandkids Sebastian 10 and Cristiano 4 who live in Tucson AZ.

HOW LONG HAVE YOU BEEN DOING MASSAGE? I opened my own business, Tara Hall Therapeutic Massage on April 2004. This April it has been 11 years.

HOW LONG HAVE YOU BEEN AN AMTA MEMBER? I started attending the AMTA educational conferences in 2003. I didn't join until 2010, while attending the National AMTA convention I met the national staff on the elevator opening morning and they invited me to sign up and



walked me through the whole enrollment on the spot online. The AMTA president invited me to a private gathering in the presidential suite later on that week. I was very impressed to see many of the instructors there and felt warmly welcomed.

WHAT GOT YOU INTERESTED/STARTED IN MASSAGE THERAPY? I moved from Minneapolis to Aberdeen to work for the Bureau of Indian Affairs, Dept. of Interior as the Great Plains Regional Personnel Officer in April of 1998. My job was stressful and required lots of travel. I met my husband and got married that same year. In 2001 we had our son John and I resigned and became a stay at home mom. I've always loved receiving massage and depended on them during my pregnancy. I decided to learn massage and I studied under Susan Hoffman's Healing Hands Clinic in Leola.

YOUR FAVORITE TECHNIQUE: I strongly believe in continuing education and I incorporate the various techniques I've learned and intuitively work with clients customizing each massage to meet their needs. I prefer doing full body massages for either 60 or 90 minutes.

YOUR BIGGEST CHALLENGE AS A THERAPIST: With years of repeat clients friendships develop and it's tempting to visit and "catch up" with clients. I believe some of that is fine, as long as it's client lead and focused. Clients are paying good money for our complete attention on their body. It's difficult for clients to be put in a position where they have to ask the MT to be quiet, so I try not to put them in that position. No or minimal talking lends itself to a better massage and the client is better able to focus on how fabulous they feel.

YOUR BEST MEMORY OF BEING A MASSAGE THERAPIST: Can't pick just one. The births are miracles, the first timers are refreshing and those transitioning/hospice are powerful.

WHAT WOULD YOU TELL NEW PEOPLE IN OUR FIELD? Always maintain your personal hygiene, be focused and present at all times with your client, don't complain and have fun and smile

WHAT ARE YOUR HOBBIES? Researching, gardening, horses and traveling

ANYTHING ELSE THAT YOU WOULD LIKE TO SHARE? (Something nobody knows about you or would be surprised to know about you): I went to Victory country school until 6th grade. No running water, cooked our food on the stove during winter and we had to use the "out houses" for restrooms.


