# Chapter Leaders Shine at CVOP!

The twelfth annual Chapter Volunteer Orientation Program (CVOP) was held in Evanston, Illinois, July 11-14. Seventy-one chapter officers representing forty-eight chapters took part in the training. More than 85 percent of the attendees were first-timers with open minds and an enthusiasm for learning!




