

SEPTEMBER 17—20, 2014

Earn some money while attending the 2014 AMTA National Convention in Denver!!

We are looking for massage therapists to provide massages during Convention, September 17-20, 2014! Twelve therapists (10 table, 2 chair) are needed for each 2-4 hour shift (longer shifts available upon request). You will be paid \$0.50/minute for the <u>massages given</u> and checks will be mailed on Monday, September 29, 2014. Shifts will be scheduled around CEU courses you register for.

We will provide the massage tables and chairs, sheets and lotion. We will also do the scheduling of clients and collect payment. All you have to do is show up on time and do what you know how to do!

Professional dress is required: khaki, black or blue pants, closed toed shoes or sandals with socks, and a convention volunteer shirt (we will provide 1 shirt, you can buy more).

You do <u>NOT</u> have to sign up for the Convention to volunteer unless you want to take classes. However, if you purchase the "exhibit hall only 3-day pass," it will allow you to see and hear Dr. Oz at the Opening Session on Thursday morning and visit the exhibit hall where you will be introduced to the top massage therapy products and leaders in the profession.

The sports massage team has been busy this summer! On July 27th, four therapists provided massage at the Rocky Mountain State Games for the track and field events in Palmer Lake. We worked on athletes ranging from 6 to 80 years old, and educated athletes, coaches and parents on the benefits of massage and how it helps before, during and after events.
