government relations

by the time this newsletter reaches you the legislature will be wrapping up its 2014 session. Unless something radical happens between the writing of this article and when you're reading it, there were three bills with impact upon the Massage Therapy Practice Act. None of which should negatively impact your practice or your business.

First, Senate Bill 27 (SB 27), the Reinstatment of the Massage Therapy Practice Act, reauthorizes the licensure of Massage Therapy for another 10 years. It's standard practice to "sunset" licensing laws automatically every ten years to make sure archaic laws don't stick around in the Utah statues and codes. AMTA-Utah Chapter worked with the legislature over the course of the interim (last autumn) to make sure our licensing act didn't expire as it would have without our input.

Second, House Bill 207 (HB 207), Massage Therapy Practice Act Amendments, which originally would have given blanket exemption from licensure to Foot Zone Therapists and Reflexologists. Our chapter provided input with Representative Brian Greene, the bill's sponsor, and along and with other concerned therapists testimony at the House Business and Labor Committee, we were able to put sufficient restrictions upon the exemption to secure the public safety and avoid any confusion among regulators about what is and what is not massage and proper Foot Zoning/Reflexology practice.

Third, House Bill 324 (HB 324), Ortho-Bionomy® Exemption Amendments, seeks to give legitimate practitioners of Ortho-Bionomy® and exemption from Massage Therapy licensure. With a number of factors considered, including that the AMTA National model legislative language allows for an exemption for Ortho-Bionomy® our chapter board decided to not oppose this bill if sufficient language were included that limited the scope of pratice to Ortho-Bionomy® and the practitioner be certified as a "Practitioner", "Advanced Practitioner" or "Instructor" all of which require 500+hours of training and 16 hours every two years of continuing education. Further, the chapter seeks Utah State Massage Board approval of certification programs for both Ortho-Bionomy® and Foot-Zone/Reflexology practitioners. Additionally, the chapter sees it necessary for any certification program for these exempted practices to include ethics training.

Our chapter's Government Relations Committee is continuing efforts with state and local governments to protect the practice of massage therapy. Coming up this spring and summer is an issue with Salt Lake County government. We will be watching this and working to keep you informed. We may be able to influence a satisfactory outcome with some educational outreach efforts with the county. If not, we may call upon your support.

As I said at the beginnning of this article, as of this writing the legislature is still in session and all three bills detailed above are not settled. We'll let you know what happens, but more importantly, if we need to take action before the end of the session we will be calling you or emailing you with more information and to suggest that you call and write your representative and senators.
